"THEMATIC COLLECTION

As I wrote in the June issue of this magazine, the fassination of stamp collecting came upon me very early on in my life and I began no doubt like almost all others, with the intention of acquiring a lot-nothing short of the whole lot of the world in stamps! Needless to say that after dabbling in the world I found my interest rapidly waning. It is also needless to say that the contact of an English Military Officer, then stationed at Peradeniya with the SEAC convinced me of the futility of this ambition-

This made my interest to narrow down in my sphere of stamps to the Commonwealth only (then known as the British Colonials) which too, I realise now, is rather very cumbersome - especially as one sees the rate and competition with which stamps are turned out by the various countries. I am thoroughly convinced of the futility of even this narrowed field, not to speak of the drain on my purse. It is anyone's guess also to imagine when a daughter of one also gets in heart and soul to dive into the mighty ocean of philately what a great drain it will be on one's purse. Still my vanity and hers will not allow us to narrow down still further.

This however, did not deter me from going further to find out ways to keep one interested In stamps without entailing much expense and at the same time without loosing interest in them. The result is thematic, or topical, collection. As this was the answer to my perplexities my next task was to choose my theme or topic. Art, culture, archaeology geography, great men, aeroplanes, railway engines. plants, birds, animals, reptiles, famous musicians, history, religion, space flight and a host of others loomed in the horizon. All of them did not appeal to me. As a geographer, however, the task of illustrating geography by means of stamps seemed a fruitful and absorbing study. I had pursued this thematic collection without in the least having an idea of a thematic collection then. So I had to select another and only 'religion' appealed to me.

Now I have two thematic pets - 'Geography in stamps' and 'Religion in stamps'. The former is for an utility purpose in that it is an aid in my profession as a teacher of geography. The latter is of course for joy and pleasure - serene and pure but also deep and unfathomable and that cannot be contained in human vocabulary. This is beside the scope of this article and let me turn back again to thematics in stamps. The pleasure and joys of the thematic collector will certainly vary directly or inversely as the themes and the likes and dislikes of the collector himself or herself.

So I shall here broadly make a few suggestions to create and interest in thematic collections. There is already the collecting instinct in man and it is quite remarkable in childhood apart from this some children are imbued with a siprit of adventure. This is the space age. There is also a thirst for Science amongst the school going population. Several countries have begun to issue stamps commemorating space events. All these can together make a few school going children at least to collect space - flight commemoratives. I am sure there is not only pleasure and joy but instructive education behind it. Well! this may be for the ardent physicist. The Biologist can collect birds, animals, reptiles, flowers and the like. Another may be interested in Communications. Such pupils will find railway engines, aeroplanes, first flight commemoratives, ships, carts and the like quite interesting.

The other day I had the fortune to get a set of christmas stamps issued by the Cook Islands for the christmas of 1966. The stamps of the denomination of I d, 4 d and 10 d show "the adoration of the wise men ". These are reproductions of fine art by Fra Angelica, Valayquey and Bosh. The 2d has a reproduction of 'the nativity' by Memling while the Is6d has that of "Adoration of the Shepherds" by Ribera. All these are masterpieces of art by the old

masters. Recently several countries have begun to reproduce famous paintings in their stamps. For the Connoisseur of Art and paintings this will form a good thematic collection.

A historian has ample to study in his field through this fascinating hobby of stamp collecting. A single set of stamps sometimes relates the full story of a country. My English military officer friend, of whom I made a casual mention at the outset of this article, was stationed in Malta during 1940, 1941 and 1942 just before he was sent out to Ceylon to join the SEAC under Lord Mountbatten. While serving there he was able to get three or four sets of twentyone stamps in each of the Maltese stamps then in use. They were issued in 1938. He presented one set to me and we discussed the set for nearly an hour. Malta's story is unfolded through this set of stamps. I am not going to tell the story here and I leave it to the Interested collector and reader to get these stamps and read the history of Malta there in. The Island of Malta is a fertile state for the collector of subjects, as its stamps are devoted to Illustrating the Island's rich and varied history. The George Cross Commemoratives will narrate a story by themselves.

I am now sure that anyone who is perplexed over the immensity of philately will now take the cue from this article and use the first opportunity to put his or her collecting to some ordered purpose.

WRITING UP STAMP COLLECTIONS

Seldom is a stamp collection complete without any writing up and the beauty of many stamp collections have been marred by excessive writing up. Stamp collectors should understand this point clearly before writing up their treasured collections.

If one desires to progress in philately, one should not only have the latest stamp of the country he collects which should be written up but also he should make provision for the next future stamp to be issued by the country details of which should have already been written up. By adopting this method of writing up before the stamp is issued, he can mount the stamp when it is issued and thereby complete the details of the stamp. He can, by writing to any of the philatelic Bureau obtain advance information of all forthcoming issues which will prove to be a useful guide both for writing up as well as to obtain future issues.

It is easy to collect stamps of countries like United States whose stamps are of the same size, perforation and printed by the same printers so that the only details necessary is the date of issue. He can devote a separate page for writing

the date of issue of stamps issued during a particular year so that the stamps could be mounted on blank paged and will stand out clearly. He can allocate a separate space for writing the name of the printers, number of stamps per sheet which will be the same for all the stamps. Thus the necessity of repetition could be easily eliminated. On the other hand, if he chooses a country whose stamps are of various sizes and shapes and printed by various printers who adopt various printing methods, he will have to spend much time gathering the necessary information for writing up his collection.

For the sake of convenience, collectors prefer to use printed gum labels to illustrate their collections but collections written by hand always present a pleasing appearance. At the start a stamp collector with a bad handwriting may experience difficulty in writing up his collection but with patience and experience this difficulty could be overcome.

If a collector uses the technique of writing up skilfully, his collection will be a thing of admiration both by the owner and by the onlookers.



(International Federation of Anglers) and the XIVth World Angling Championship (at Dunaujvaros, Southern Hungary, August 20–28, 1967, the Hungarian Post Office will issue a set of seven stamps depicting fishes of Hungary. Day of issue: August 22, 1967. Size 43 x 33mm, photogravure in several colours. The designs are by Adam Cziglenyi, graphic artist. On each stamp the Latin and the Hungarian names of the fishes are indicated.

20 f: Acipenser ruthenus L. (sterlet). 60 f: Lucio perca lucioperca L. (perch-pike). 1 Ft: Cyprinus carpio L. (carp). 1,70 Ft: Silurus glanis L. (sheat-fish). 2 Ft: Esox lucius L. (pike). 2,50 Ft: Aspius aspius L. (chrup). 3 x l Ft: Depicts a scene from an anglers' competition: In the background a view of Dunaujvaros and the emblem of C. I. P. S. may be seen. Inscriptions (in Hungarian): 'International Federation of Anglers,' 'XIVth Congress of C. I. P. S. 1967' and 'Hungarian Post' The surtax is to the advantage of the National Federation of Hungarian Anglers, organizer of the Congress and the Championship, to cover the costs.




