



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## **Editorial**


#### Dear Friends.

As we step into the digital age, the Indian Postal Department is all set to revolutionize its services with the implementation of a new software system known as IT2.0, to enhance operational efficiency, security and service delivery. This project involves installing new software and upgrading existing systems across post offices nationwide. TCS is implementing this project including Point of Sale (PoS) solution across 24,000 post offices, making it one of the largest such implementations globally. It helps to streamline transactions and improve service speed. The project also includes Core Banking Solution which allows account holders to operate their deposit accounts (including Philatelic Deposit Account) from any CBS enabled post office in India. A call center with multi-lingual support has been established to assist customers with their queries and concerns. Other facilities are a web portal with consignment tracking capabilities, Employee Self-Service Portal, Service Desk Application etc.

The Department of Posts has already conducted a successful pilot run in Karnataka, where dynamic digital transactions were tested at post offices in Mysuru and Bengaluru. Due to this implementation some post offices in Karnataka experienced temporary suspension of services with the new system going live.



As the department embarks on this digital journey, we can expect improved efficiency, increased transparency, and a more streamlined experience for customers. 





# **AMSIPEX-26**

AMSIPEX-26, Newsletter No.1, June 2025

We are pleased to announce AMSIPEX-26, the 2nd International Virtual Aero- and Astrophilatelic Exhibition, to be held from 14th to 22nd February 2026. As part of these proceedings, we will celebrate World Air Mail Day on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2026 with an International Webinar, Special Cover release, and other activities.

We have confirmed support from the following societies as Joint-Organisers:







American Air Mail Society

Royal Belgian Astrophilatelic Society, COSMOS

Cercle Aérophilatélique Français (C.A.F.)

AMSIPEX-25 held in February 2025, marked a significant milestone in the field of aero- and astrophilately. This was the 1<sup>st</sup> International Virtual Exhibition, and it received overwhelming global participation (the AMSIPEX-25 report is attached). We introduced several pioneering initiatives aimed at inclusivity, education, and engagement:

- Medals Awarded to All Exhibitors (Including Eligible Single-Frame Exhibits) For the first time, all exhibitors were recognized with medals. Notably, all single-frame exhibits that scored between 55 and 100 marks were also awarded medals, encouraging broader participation and maintaining high standards of exhibit quality.
- Introduction of the "Novice Class" A new Novice Class was introduced, exclusively for first-time exhibitors. This innovation aimed to nurture emerging talent and provide a supportive platform for newcomers to philately.
- Online Feedback Sessions with Juries Post-exhibition, interactive feedback sessions were held virtually, allowing exhibitors to directly engage with juries. These sessions provided constructive critiques and guidance, enhancing the educational value of participation.

#### Additional innovations we plan to introduce in AMSIPEX-26 include:

- **Broad spectrum exhibiting**. We will encourage exhibits under all FIP classes (e.g. Postal History, Postal Stationary, Thematic etc.) so long as they are built around Aerophilatelic and Astrophilatelic topics. These will be judged under the FIP rules applicable to their respective classes.
- World Team Championship. We will allow three exhibitors from a single country to form a team. While their exhibits will continue to be eligible for individual medals, the team scores will be aggregated and medals awarded to the team in the name of their country.
- Inviting all FISA member associations to be joint-organiser. We are trying to rope in as many of the 26 national Aerophilatelic and Astrophilatelic associations world-wide to participate even more actively in Amsipex as joint-organisers.
- Multi-language support (experimental). We are planning to allow exhibits to be submitted in English, French, German and Spanish with a facility for jury and visitors to view the exhibit in any of these languages.

While we will be posting our schedule including IREX and entry forms shortly, you can start planning your individual exhibits as well as forming your teams for the single frame World Championship medal for your country.

I request all clubs and societies to come forward and sign up as joint-organisers and to share this communication with your fellow members. Please write to me in you want a translation of this message in a language of your choice.

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# Stamp of the month

# Finland - 10k Rose On Pale Rose Stamp, 1860



Price: USD 8,500

The 10k rose on pale rose stamp was the first printed Finnish stamp, appearing in 1860. The design of these goods include the coat of arms and a distinctive serpentine roulette perforation. These stamps were produced with Russian money. The unique used block of four 1860 10k rose on pale rose, roulette I, with broad horizontal spacing and limited vertical spacing between the stamps, sold for \$8,500 at the Spink sale on May 16, 2008. The auction house characterized the item as "exceptionally well centered, strong rich color, top and bottom pairs, each with a nice strike of a low boxed "Jyväskylä/5 Decem. 1864" postmark, bottom right stamp with one missing tooth, very fine". This block is regarded to be a one-of-a-kind philatelic jewel due to its importance and rarity of usage.

# One Design, Many Nations — The Beauty of Joint Stamp Issues...

This article continues to explore India's collaborative Stamp issues with countries around the world, showcasing shared history, culture, and diplomacy.

Part #3 of this article highlights the shared values between the people of India and Japan, such as liberty and parliamentary democracy, which serve as a strong foundation for strengthening their constructive partnership in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. As a symbol of this enduring bond, joint postage stamps were released by both the countries, reflecting the cultural and diplomatic ties that unite them.

#### 3. 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Diplomatic Relation between India – Japan (2002)

#### About the parallel joint stamp issue with different designs...

On 26-apr-2002, India issued two commemorative postage stamps to celebrate the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Japan. These stamps beautifully showcased the traditional performing arts of both countries - Kathakali from India and Kabuki from Japan - symbolizing their shared cultural heritage and mutual appreciation of classical art forms.

Date of Issue: 26-apr-2002.

Earlier, on 12-apr-2002, as part of the "Japan - South Asia in the 21st Century" initiative, Japan released a commemorative stamp featuring the Taj Mahal, offering a tribute to 50 years of enduring friendship with India through one of its most iconic symbols. Together, these stamp releases reflected the deep cultural bonds that have enriched the bilateral relationship over the decades.

#### India and Japan: A Golden Jubilee of Cultural Bond and Shared Values (1952–2002)

In 2002, India and Japan celebrated a remarkable milestone - the 50th anniversary of the establishment of their diplomatic relationship. This golden jubilee was not merely an occasion to commemorate five decades of official engagement but an opportunity to reflect on a unique and enduring friendship that has flourished through mutual respect, cultural appreciation, and shared values. As Asia's two great civilizations, India and Japan have historically been connected not only through trade and travel but through common ideals such as peace, harmony, and the pursuit of knowledge.

#### A gesture of mutual respect and the significance of 26th April

The foundation of the India-Japan relationship can be traced back to 26 April 1952, the day both countries formally established diplomatic ties. But the bond had roots that ran deeper than official diplomatic agreements. After the end of World War II, Japan was emerging from a period of devastation and international isolation. In a world still reeling from conflict, many countries were cautious in their dealings with Japan.

India, however, took a different approach. Rather than joining collective post-war settlements that placed restrictions on Japan, India chose a path of friendship and solidarity. This belief was reflected in India's decision to not sign the San Francisco Peace Treaty of 1951, which many nations agreed to but India saw as overly punitive and unbalanced.

Instead, India and Japan signed a separate bilateral peace treaty on 26 April 1952, a move that was widely appreciated by the Japanese people. It was an act that reflected deep empathy and foresight - a recognition of Japan's potential to rise again with the support of its neighbours, rather than judgment. This gesture laid the cornerstone for a friendship that would grow stronger with time.

#### The Cultural connection: Kathakali and Kabuki



In this, one of the most beautiful aspects of the India - Japan relationship has been the growing cultural exchange between the two countries. As part of the golden jubilee celebrations in 2002, attention was drawn not only to trade and development but to shared cultural heritage. In particular, two traditional dance-drama forms - India's Kathakali and Japan's Kabuki - came to symbolize the richness and depth of this connection.

As a role in guiding collectors' attention to specific design aspects, the sheetlet of the India-Japan Joint issue featured embedded Philatelic Latin Square (PLS) patterns.

Date of Issue: 26-apr-2002

Though they come from different lands, Kathakali and Kabuki share many similarities. Both are classical art forms known for their elaborate costumes, expressive makeup, stylized gestures, and storytelling rooted in mythology and folklore. Kathakali, originating from the Indian state of Kerala, often depicts tales from the Mahabharata and Ramayana. Kabuki, which developed during Japan's Edo period, brings to life historical dramas, domestic stories, and moral conflicts.

They both showcase how dance and drama can transcend language barriers and communicate universal emotions of joy, sorrow, heroism, and sacrifice.

And, these artistic exchanges serve as reminders that, despite the geographical distance, India and Japan have shared artistic philosophies - an attention to detail, a respect for tradition, and a deep appreciation of beauty in storytelling. Kathakali and Kabuki became more than performances; they became symbols of how ancient traditions continue to bridge modern relationships.

#### A Relationship rooted in values

As India and Japan celebrated their 50th year of diplomatic friendship in 2002, it became clear that their bond was not just about agreements or trade. It was about shared cultural wisdom, mutual empathy, and the desire to walk together on a path of progress and harmony.



As a distinctive design element, here is the Bottom-Right Traffic Light feature in the India-Japan Joint stamp sheetlet.

Whether through the grace of Kathakali and Kabuki, the memory of 26<sup>th</sup> April, or the moral stand taken over a treaty, the story of India and Japan over the past fifty years has been one of listening, learning, and mutual admiration.

# Travancore Railway Anchal Service (T.R.A.S.) Postmarks

The first Travancore railway service was started in 1904 June 1st, from Quilon to Punalur, and

extended services to Shencottah (Travancore) on 1904 November 26. And further extension of rail services from Quilon to Trivandrum

were started on 1918 January 1st.

The earliest known mail carried with Set/Sort/Shift Number (S 2) is shown here (1907). The S 2 (set/sort) number denotes the shift system of the sorting clerks, inside the office/train.


The mail vans of Travancore Anchal were connected to the outgoing trains to Madras from Quilon, and were detached at Shencottah, and then reconnected to the incoming trains arriving from Madras. All mails carried were cancelled with 'T.R.A.S./IN' (incoming mails) or 'T.R.A.S./OUT' (outgoing mails).



This was the earliest rail route.... Quilon to Shencotta.

#### Rail stations between Quilon and Shencottah

Quilon, Kundara, Kottarakara, Avaniswaram, Punalur, Edamon, Tenmalai, Aryankavu, Bhagavathipuram & Shencottah.

Out of these Quilon, Punalur & Shencottah are the major stations. This rail route have 5 tunnels through the Cardamom Hills and through other hill stations, the longest tunnel being at Aryankavu.

Set numbers, for the British India Railway Mail system, were used to distinguish between groups of sorters working on a shift system. It is an usual procedure for the British India railway station office....and Travancore seems to follow the British system.


In 1907, Indian Rail Mail services were divided into 4 circles, and each circle in charge of an Inspector-General of Railway Mail Services & Sorting.

In 1909, a reorganisation of the Anchal Transit Agency with revised rules of its operations were promulgated, with 15 new transit stations in the state of Travancore.

The Southern Circle was decommissioned in 1918, probably with the extension of rail services from Quilon to Trivandrum in 1918.

In Travancore, Set or Mail Sorters (S 1 & S 2) markings, exists only for a shorter period, as from the evidence in hand...whereas T.R.A.S. 'IN & OUT' cancels were in use, till the end.

#### <u>Travancore Railway Anchal Service (T.R.A.S.) Postmarks..</u>

It was P.G.Wells and Dr N S Mooss, who earlier recorded the track for the cancellations regarding travel of Travancore mail by train.

There are 6 different types of T.R.A.S Postmarks with sub varieties from 1907 to 1949.

What follows are the different types of railway cancellation, I have come to notice, so far.

#### TYPE 1





1907...posted to Quilon.

'T.R.A.S. IN' (inbound train to Quilon)...28mm.





1909...from Punalur via Quilon to a stamp dealer in Attungal.

'T.R.A.S. IN' (inbound train to Quilon)..28mm.

#### TYPE 2





1923...from Chirayankeezhu to Changnacherry.

'T.R.A.S.' in Arch format close to the central crossbar. 'T.R.A.S. OUT' (outbound train from Trivandrum)..34mm

This type of franking did not last long as this was the year of the *Great flood of '99'* (1924)

#### TYPE 3





1924...from Varkala to Trivandrum.

T.R.A.S.' in Arch format close to the upper circle. 'T.R.A.S. IN' (inbound train to Trivandrum)...34mm.

This type of franking did not last long as this was the year of the *Great flood of '99'* (1924)

1935...from Quilon via Alwaye to Cochin.

'T.R.A.S. OUT' Small font (outbound train from Quilon)...28mm to Cochin.

# **An Overview of EUROPA Stamps**

#### By Kottai Surendran Palani

#### **Objective**

This article attempts to give an overview of EUROPA stamps to the readers. It familiarizes the readers the timeline history from the inception until now weaving the highlights in short. At the end, reader may have a panoramic view of Europa stamps across the years.

#### Introduction

EUROPA stamps are special annual joint Issues from European postal administrations. EUROPA stamps were first released in 1956. Next year in 2026 we will have platinum jubilee celebration issues.

Europa stamps are issued by the member of the following organizations uniting the postal administrators

- The European Community EC (1956 to 1959)
- Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations CEPT (1960 to 1992)
- The PostEurop Association (Since 1993)

EUROPA stamps underline cooperation in the postal domain and promotion of philately. These stamps highlight Europe as a central theme, emphasizing the region's shared values and vast heritage. They help raise awareness of Europe's common roots, culture, and history, making them some of the most collected and popular stamps worldwide.

#### **Distinctive features of Europa stamps**

- They follow a common theme every year
- During 1960 to 1992, they displayed either initials 'CEPT' or the emblem



- Then they displayed =UROPA uring 1993 to 2010
- From 2011, Europa stamps uispiay new logo preceded by a mailbox

#### Theme and Design

#### Common Theme:

Every year the member-nations release EUROPA stamps following the common theme decided ahead of the year.

#### Common Design:

During the initial years, the stamps had a common design from 1956 to 1973, (except for 1957). There were a few exceptions in the common designs. Some countries featured their own designs displaying the word EUROPA.

#### Country's own designs:

Common designs were discontinued from 1974. From 1974, Member-nations have been releasing their own exquisitely designed stamps adhering to the theme of the year.

#### **Countries and Stamps**

The first Europa issue was on 15 September 1956. The postal administrations of the six nations - Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands issued 13 different stamps with a common

design: a Tower made up of the letters of the word EUROPA and surrounded by construction scaffolding.

Thereafter year on year the number of stamps and issuing countries were on the rise. By 2009, as many as 63 countries issued 112 EUROPA stamps. According to the Colnect website, there are 10, 600 EUROPA stamps and MS issued so far.

#### **Common Design Stamps**

EUROPA stamps followed common designs for initial seventeen years. Select stamps are shown below to explain how common design was implemented. Exceptions to the common designs are indicated in red.



Now we shall see below the EUROPA issues of **three celebration years**. (1) 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of CEPT, (2) Millennium year 2000 and (3) Fifty years of EUROPA stamps celebrated in 2006.

#### 1984 - 25 Years of CEPT

The 25th anniversary of CEPT was celebrated in 1984. CEPT was established in 1959, making its 25th anniversary in 1984. This milestone was commemorated with a special stamp issue of EUROPA series, which featured the theme "Bridges". The UK, for example, released a set of four stamps as in the FDC ⇒

#### 2000 - The Millenium Year

In the year 2000, the EUROPA stamp theme was "New Millennium - European way to common integration", with a common design featuring a tower of six stars built by children on a green field, with the letter "E" for Europe. The design by Jean-Paul Cousin depicts a tower of six stars, representing the original six members of the ECSC, being built by children of different heritage on a green field with the letter "E" symbolizing a fertile Europe. While many countries used the common design, some chose to issue a second stamp with their own design, like Croatia, Monaco, or Hungary.







# **Book Review**

#### "Guardians of Heritage: Exploring the World of GI Tag Products of India"

A Geographical Indication Tag (GI Tag) is a certification that identifies a product as originating from a specific geographic region, where a particular quality, reputation, or characteristic of the product is attributable to its geographical origin. India is a land of diverse cultures, traditions and indigenous products, many of which have gained international recognition for their uniqueness and heritage. The GI tag helps consumers identify authentic products and supports the preservation of traditional craftsmanship and cultural heritage.





In December 1999, Parliament passed the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act 1999. This Act seeks to provide for the registration and protection of Geographical Indications relating to goods in India. The Act is administered by the Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trademarks, who is the Registrar of Geographical Indications. Once the application is received it goes through various scrutinising processes and evaluation. These are the steps involved prior to registration status. Once approved then GI Tag is provided for the product and the status is identified as "Registered".

I have much pleasure to introduce the book "Guardians of Heritage: Exploring the World of GI Tag Products of India" authored by Shri. Senthilkumar Chandrasekaran. This book contains careful compilation of Philatelic materials related to GI Tag Products registered in India. India, with its vast cultural and ecological diversity, has bestowed GI recognition upon a wide array of products like Darjeeling Tea, Tirupati Laddu, Kanchipuram Silk, Maharashtra's Alphonso Mango, Mysore Silk etc.

The chapters of this book are arranged as per the categories of GI Tag Products viz Agricultural Products, Food Stuff, Handicraft, Manufactured Products, Natural Resources, Products from Other Countries. Under each category similar materials are grouped together - for example, different types of rice, mangoes, silk sarees etc. - to compare and understand the minor differences between each product. Few products from other countries which are registered with a GI Tag in India are also included.

This compilation comprises 376 products out of 658 registered products from India and 26 products out of 39 registered products from outside India. At the end of the book a list of State wise GI Tag products and an index in alphabetical order are included. No doubt, these inclusions are very helpful to readers to find out a particular product.

A total of 586 philatelic materials are depicted in this 280 pages fully coloured book. The book is made in A4 size with hard bound. The high quality 130 GSM paper makes the printing quality very attractive.

This book is not only to serve as a reference for philatelists and collectors but also to foster greater awareness and appreciation for India's GI-tagged treasures. I strongly recommend every philatelists who are collecting GI Tag products of philatelic materials, to keep it as a reference book in their library.



# Philately 2025 - With a Goan Connect

The State of Goa on India's west coast has a long and fascinating history. Goa was part of various ancient Indian empires, including the Maurya and Satavahana dynasties. In 1510, the Portuguese conquered Goa and ruled it for over 450 years. During this period, Goa became a major hub for trade, culture, and Christianity in Asia. The Portuguese introduced their language, culture, and architecture, which still influence Goa today. With the colonial powers waning in the Indian subcontinent and the mainland attaining independence in 1947, Goa finally got liberated on 19<sup>th</sup> December 1961. With this change in power, postal services also changed over from C.T.T (Correios Telégrafos e Telefones) to P&T (Post & Telegraph) under the Indian Administration. Stamps of Portuguese India were effective up to 28<sup>th</sup> December 1961. Last Portuguese-India stamp was officially issued in1960.



There was no proper documentation on stamps and stationery related to Goa was available. Keeping this aspect in mind Mr. Rolando de Melo brings out a valuable and excellent compilation entitled "PHILATELY- with a Goan Connect". This book gives us chronological information regarding the various stamps, cancellations and other philatelic materials released in Goa from 1871 to 2025. The first edition of this book was released in 2022 and it got Silver medal at National Philatelic Exhibition - Amritpex 2023 under literature class. The updated second edition also carries an important section on Portuguese India Stamps and other materials.

Another unique, quite interesting and challenging section in this book is on Carried covers to Antarctica. Indian Scientific Expeditions to Antarctica- ISEA carries mail from Goa to Indian Post Offices at Dakshin Gangotri (defunct) Maitri and Bharati. This edition also won the Vermeil Medal at Maharashtra State Level Philatelic Exhibition - Mahapex 2025.

As the author said in his preface, the objective of this compilation is to put together, in the form of a catalogue and document various activities by the Postal Service of Goa Division, Goa Philatelic and Numismatic Society and other private entities.

The book is divided into four major chapters as India-Antarctica Journeys, in Carried Covers, Pre-Liberation Era, Post-Liberation Era, and Goan Philatelic Issues in Foreign Countries.


